WAC 2021 AGM Track Report

AVSL

Round 1 started on Sat 28th Nov 2020 after two rounds of Come and Try days.

The first four Rounds were restricted to 50 competitors in a one hour session with only 4 events, two Track and two Field. BRAC conducted two one hour sessions of AVSL and then had an added third non-point scoring session with non-AVSL events.

Rounds 5 – 10 were conducted as normal competition. The final six rounds included two twilight competitions, two re-shuffled programs, a Thursday evening and a Saturday morning competition.

The total number of competitors averaged 100 for Rounds 5 – 10.

Due to the disrupted season and limited events on offer, BRAC Premierships were not awarded.

After Round 10 (final round) Wendouree AC were placed 3rd on the AVSL ladder in Division 3 behind Wyndham and Bendigo Harriers. Wendouree came up against Eureka in the Playoff to challenge for Division 2 Promotion / Relegation. With only a few athletes competing in the Playoff, Wendouree were beaten by Eureka.

It's exciting to note that Wendouree will be the No. 1 ranked team in Division 3 next season. Let's rally the athletes and have a concerted effort to take out the Division 3 Premiership. Our 2020/21 score was well above the teams below us and the two teams being relegated from Div 2. It's a case of getting the athletes to compete each week and encouraging them to participate in 3 events and a relay each time. We have proven our team can score over 20000 points quite easily

In individual events, Wendouree AC claimed 21 Gold, 24 Silver and 16 Bronze medals. Wendouree entered 10 teams in the relay events, winning 2 Gold, 2 Silver and 1 Bronze.

Wendouree Athletic Club - 2020 Cross-Country Report

The 2020 Cross-Country Season served up dramatic change arising from the impact of the global events that manifested themselves through all levels of society due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Terms like social distancing, lockdown, Ring of Steel and community transmission gained prominence in the lexicon as many of us experienced disruption in a manner beyond our usual scope. As a consequence of the restrictions that were required to be observed during the year all A.V. XCR, B.R.A.C. and club races were cancelled. This was the first year since 1958 that the club has not staged a formal cross-country season.

Adaptability can often rise during challenging times. Whilst we were unable to gather in groups or have close contact, we were still able to exercise and what better way to do that than run. Aided by available technology such as GPS devices the opportunity to undertake a virtual series of events for members was an obvious choice to fill a previously unconsidered void. Held in conjunction with the Eureka Athletic Club the virtual season provided a welcome outlet for many to engage in their preferred form of physical activity and for some the chance to participate in events they previously or otherwise may not have considered. On many occasions the combined participation of the two clubs was in excess of 100 competitors indicating some measure of success, or need, for the club to provide such an opportunity during this time. We even had a virtual end of season presentation. Thanks to all those that contributed to the conduct of the virtual season through promotion via social media, collation and publication of results, and, of course, to those that ran, walked and jogged each week.

Going forward safety continues to be a primary concern. Modifications to courses are likely to be inevitable with ongoing development and increased traffic affecting some of our traditional stomping grounds. As we return to some semblance of normalcy with the resumption of organized events our collaboration with the Eureka Athletic Club for a number of local races should continue to provide mutual benefits, although boosting our participation numbers should also be a focus. While conceived from necessity the option of the virtual program provides for many possibilities for ongoing and expanded engagement for those with an inclination toward our sport.
