Neville Down

Joined: 25/01/1989

Neville Down joined the Wendouree Athletic Club after shifting to Ballarat to undertake tertiary studies in Bachelor of Education – Physical Education. Hailing from Speed, in the Wimmera, Neville came to the club at a time of re-establishment for the club on the track and at the dawn of one its strongest periods in cross country. As an athlete he demonstrated range and diversity. Essentially of the mould of a middle distance athlete with a 1.55 800m to his name through to 18.58 for the Lake his value on the track extended to being a very competent hurdler and a capable exponent of the vertical jumps.

Off the track Neville's endeavours has left an even more indelible mark. As a coach he has provided expert guidance to many athletes in sprints, middle and long distance, a number of whom have achieved success at local, state and national level with some progressing on to the international arena.

Neville has served on the Wendouree Athletic Club committee for many years including holding the position of Vice-President. He has represented the club on the board of the Ballarat Regional Athletic Centre, as well as the competition committees of B.R.A.C. and Athletics Victoria that have formulated the program of the summer AVSL season and the staging of the Country Championships hosted in Ballarat. Whilst continuing to be an active athlete Neville also contributes to the conduct of the weekly track and field competition assisting as an announcer and track official.

The history of the club has also been enriched by Neville's photography skills. Through the lens of his camera Neville has made a significant contribution to the pictorial chronicle of the club recording numerous competition and team photos. He has also undertaken to digitise and log all available historic club photographs from the past seventy plus years.

Neville Down's appointment as life member of the Wendouree Athletic Club is due recognition of his outstanding contribution over more than three decades.
