We saw some great results throughout the season with the BRAC Ballarat Teams in the AV XCR'22 competition. We also had a number of athletes compete at the State and National Championships with outstanding results. In the Nation Cross Country Mitch Korosec finished 13th overall in the under 14 men's 3km, 4th Victorian over the line and he also received a silver medal in team's event. Not one of Zac's best runs but very creditable. He wins the award for compassion and sportsmanship after he assisted a fellow athlete across the finish line who had collapsed on the course.

Congratulation to everyone involved in the Ballarat AVSL 2022/23 competition. What a season! We took out the AV Division 2 premiership (from Mentone), in the BRAC competition we won the Open Women, Open Men, Open Combined, 40+ Women, U14 Women and U18 Women premierships. Thank you to everyone from Wendouree that put their hands up to compete, officiate and help out throughout the season.

We had some outstanding performances in the Vic Country Champs. In a quick summary of individual results Wendouree won 16-gold, 21-silver and 15-bronze medals over the 3 days of competition. The number of personal bests across the competition was amazing. Well done to everyone that competed and once again thank you to all our officials and club helpers for making the competition happen and run smoothly. We must also acknowledge Angela Williams who was again the winner of the Athletics Chilwell Veteran of the meet award.

The State championships were no different with lots of medals and PB's. The Wendouree athletes brought home 2 gold medals, 4 silver medals and 4 bronze medals. Congratulations to everyone who competed.

At the National championships the junior athletes were outstanding and just to mention a couple of athletes Lachlan O'Keefe who won a gold medal in the U20 High Jump, and Mitch Korosec who won Bronze in the u15 3000m.

Another exciting competition that happened during the 2023 year was the World Cross Country Championships at Bathurst and a big congratulation to Angela Williams for her amazing run at the World Master Cross Country Championships at Bathurst. Ang is now the 50+ Female World Masters Champion. For those who follow our athletes via Facebook and Instagram, thank you to Caitlin Christie who, after many hours officiating, spends endless hours at night trolling through results to post the results, so we and all our family and friends, are kept informed during and after all the athletes' events. Also thank you to Nev for his fabulous photography throughout the season, we all love seeing your photos.

Thank you again to everyone that helps organise and run the junior Track and Field competition on Friday nights during the warmer months, the participations numbers are again right up there again this year, and we had lots of happy kids and parents.

The junior cross-country competition has started back up again, and we have great numbers this year. Friday night seems to work well as it is growing each year.


